#### Ten things to keep in mind as we pray

- 1. All God can do is give Love. 1 John 4:8 'God is love'.
- **2.** God excludes nothing human, no human situation, from His Love. *John* 12:32 'And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all people to myself.'
- 3. Just because prayer is 'difficult' or 'dry' does not mean it is not good. It's still God's time. *Hebrews 13:8* 'Jesus Christ is the same today as he was yesterday and as he will be for ever.'
- **4. Know that God is accepting you and welcoming you. God's desire is always to bestow Himself.** *John 6:37* 'Everyone whom the Father gives me will come to me; I will certainly not reject anyone who comes to me.'
- 5. If we want to find God, it is impossible that God will fail to communicate Himself God has already been seeking you. *Matthew 7:11* 'How much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him!' *Hebrews 13:5* 'God himself has said: I shall not fail you or desert you.'
- 6. Christ Jesus has buried your past in the tomb with Him and He is going to take care of your future. *Romans 6:3* 'When we were baptised into Christ Jesus, were baptised into his death' & *John 14:3* 'And after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you to myself, so that you may be with me where I am.'
- 7. In the pain of loneliness, open yourself to God's company, His pressing nearness. Matthew 1:23 [Jesus is:] 'Immanuel, a name which means "God-is-with-us"'. [Jesus' first work is to be with us, to be our companion.] &Luke 10:9 'The kingdom of God is very near to you' and Luke 17:21 'The kingdom of God is in the midst of you.'
- 8. Silence in prayer can feel like nothing, but in that silence God is preparing you to meet Him, to be a bearer of His joy and peace. 1 Kings 19:8-13 [Elijah knows God in silence] & Galatians

- 5:22 'the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness...'
- 9. Lord Jesus Christ, interior light, let not my doubts nor my darkness speak to me. Let my heart always welcome your love. Words of St Augustine, which invite us to welcome the brightness and truth of what Christ says to us and to let it shine through our doubts and darkness.
- **10.** Often, prayer goes beyond words and tends towards the comfortable silence of those who love each other. When St Thérèse of Lisieux was asked what words she said in prayer on her sick bed, she replied: 'I say nothing. I love Him.'

#### LOURDES ASSOCIATE FUND COLLECTION:

The Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes takes place this year from the  $5^{th}$  to  $10^{th}$  of September. There are several 'stalwarts' of this wonderful faith event from our own parish. We will be bringing around 100 sick pilgrims to Our Lady's Shrine where countless people have experienced God's grace and healing. For many years, parishioners were invited to help contribute to the cost of bringing a sick pilgrim to Lourdes through the *Lourdes Associate Fund*. At present, we ask each sick pilgrim to contribute €595 towards the cost of his or her travel and stay. We never refuse an application on the grounds of not being able to afford this. The actual cost per sick pilgrim is almost €1,200, factoring in the expense of necessary medical equipment and supplies.

This weekend, 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> August, we will have a Lourdes Associate Membership collection outside the church after Mass to give you an opportunity to contribute to the cost of bringing sick pilgrims on our Diocesan Pilgrimage. If anyone would like their intentions brought to the Grotto at Lourdes, please leave them into the sacristy in an envelope marked for Fr Damian's attention. Your intentions will be remembered at the Masses we celebrate there. Thank you on behalf of our sick pilgrims in anticipation of your support of our Diocesan Pilgrimage.
